National Rank #5 (Class of 2017) - [Nate Pierre-Louis](#) 5'5" Forward. Plainfield, NJ. [Pierre-Louis](#) is a prolific scorer that dominates offensively in every way imaginable. He was able to use his speed and moves to get by defenders and finish at the rim. When the defenders started to play off him, [Pierre-Louis](#) started hitting mid-range and 3 point shots consistently.



National Rank #9 (Class of 2017) - [Marques Watson](#) 5'1" Point Guard. Brooklyn, NY. [Watson](#) is lightning quick and has great ball handling skills. Defenders had a hard time trying to keep [Watson](#) on the perimeter as he drove past defenders using a quick first step and once he was in the lane; there was no stopping him from finding an open teammate for a bucket.



(Class of 2016) - [Deondre Bourne](#) Guard. Brooklyn, NY. [Bourne](#) was a smooth player that handled the ball very well in traffic. He often split defenders on his way to the basket and picked up easy assists.



(Class of 2016) [Khalir Johnson](#). Forward. Wilmington, NJ. [Johnson](#) dominated inside using his big strong body and scored almost every time he touched the ball. [Johnson](#) also looked good in transition finishing on the break.

(Class of 2017) [Endel Sanchez](#). Forward/Guard. East Hartford, CT. [Sanchez](#) has a good size and long distance shooting ability. [Sanchez](#) scores in multiple ways using a dribble drive to open up the floor and hit open shots or find teammates for easy baskets.

(Class of 2017) [Keonte Lucas](#). Forward. East Harford, CT. [Lucas](#) is a strong player that bodies players, which allows him to score in bunches.
